Two longer distances will be on 122cm faces with 80cm faces for the two shorter distances.

Compound and recurve will shoot inner 6 ring faces at the shorter distances.

Longbow and Barebow will shoot full face for all distances

All ends will be 6 arrow ends.

Disability Championship

Disabled: Members must have either a World Archery classification (National or International) or be a member who considers themselves to have a disability. Each classification may be split into Men and Women should numbers allow. Otherwise Men and Women will shoot together in each classification.
